Throughout the day your pupils will be engaged in all the following activities:

- ❖ **Light** - We take electric light for granted today but how did people manage in medieval times? Light is also used to measure time - both these aspects and much more are explored in this practical workshop.
- ❖ **Sound** - Does a large instrument make a high or a low sound? Can we make our own musical instrument? What does it feel like to make a musical sound in a big space? This workshop is reinforced by the organ demonstration at the end of the day.
- ❖ **Structure** - Even in 20th century some cathedrals took over 50 years to build! This guided tour looks at the physics of such a building and examines the materials used.
- ❖ **Tessellation** - The medieval tiled floors are excellent examples of tessellation. Using shape kits groups of pupils will devise their own tessellation patterns in an authentic surrounding.
- ❖ **Maths quiz** - There is more than one way to solve many problems - the children will start to think, talk and experience maths in the real world.

Each day will conclude with "Extreme Organ" a chance to meet and talk to a cathedral organist and hear the organ in all its glory.

Places are limited to 5 classes per day. Book early to avoid disappointment!

Cost - £4.50 per pupil. No charge for accompanying adults.
