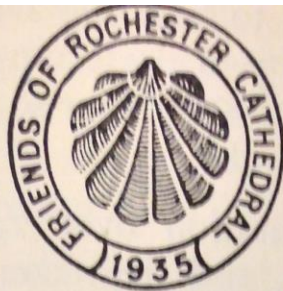

PARTICULARS OF MEMBERSHIP

THE Association of the Friends of Rochester Cathedral was formed in 1935, as it was felt that there were many who would like to be associated with this ancient and interesting church and to have a share in the preservation and upkeep of the fabric.

The Diocese and Cathedral of Rochester go back to the beginning of English Christianity. This is not to be confused with Christianity in what we now speak of as England, for Christianity flourished in Kent soon after the year A.D. 200, and although there is no proof of a Christian Church in Rochester in those early days, there is at least a likelihood that there was one. The Mission sent by Pope Gregory the Great, and welcomed and aided by King Ethelbert, secured the founding of the See of Canterbury about A.D. 597, and those of Rochester and London in A.D. 604. Close to the West Door of the Cathedral the foundations of the apse of the old Saxon Church were discovered—semicircular lines just inside the Cathedral mark the site—and the foundations of its Nave walls were traced running westwards across the cemetery outside. No foundations of a western apse have been discovered. The Cathedral Church as it stands to-day is an interesting epitome of English architecture from early Norman to the present century—the latter represented by restoration work.

All who care for this venerable church are therefore asked to join the Association of Friends of Rochester

Cathedral, and thus to help the Dean and Chapter to bear the responsibility of preserving for future generations a building which stands for so much in the history of our National Church.

Since the inauguration over 2,000 Friends have enrolled themselves, and their contributions have resulted in much valuable work in several ways. Important and necessary repairs to the fabric have been carried out, especially to parapets, roofs, and copings. During the war, funds were supplied by the Friends for defence work against bomb damage, blast, and fire. But it is especially due to their efforts that there has been revealed the interest and beauty of the Monastic Cloisters, its buildings, and its garth. The Chapter House doorway has been opened and the exquisite Romanesque carving of its masonry shown. Within the Chapter House, Priors' burial places have been discovered; the foundations of the pillars which carried a gallery across the west end from the dormitory to the Cathedral have been exposed; the refectory doorway and its adjacent washing-trough have been made objects of interest; and the fine vaulted archway entered from the main road of the Precinct has been opened out. Of the Cellarer's buildings some walls have been shown, and the Tudor buttresses clearly tell what King Henry the Eighth planned for the housing of his retinue. Funds are urgently needed for all this work. Will you become a Friend and help?

The minimum subscription has been fixed at 5s. per annum, which it is hoped will enable all who wish to do so to enrol themselves, but it is also hoped that many will be able to give larger sums. There is also a Corporate Membership for Schools, Colleges, Parochial Church Councils, etc., with a minimum subscription of 10s. per annum, whilst Individual Life Membership is £10, or Joint Life Membership, for husband and wife, £15 15s. Boys and girls under 18 years of age, 2s. per annum. Each Friend receives a Card of Membership

and a copy of the Annual Report is sent to each Member other than Junior Members, when published. A form of application will be found at the end of this Report and should be sent to the Honorary Secretary, The Precinct, Rochester.

Friends who visit the Cathedral and attend Festivals are asked to wear the Badge of Membership, illustrated on the cover. It consists of a gold scallop on a red field with the words "Friends of Rochester Cathedral" round the rim and the date of the inception. Badges are 2s. od. (1s. 6d. for Junior Members) and may be obtained from the Honorary Secretary.

THE CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

THE Friends undertook a great task in 1962. The Cloisters, built by Bishop Ernulf A.D. 1114, were encrusted with dirt, and rapidly perishing. The Friends undertook to start cleaning them. Knowing that the cost would be over £3,000, they had only enough in hand for the first half of the work. A gift of £500 and other special gifts could take the work a little further. But we shall not start again at once. We are awaiting the Architect's progress report, and earnestly hoping that this report will stir a sufficient response to enable us to go through with the job, and save the Cloisters.

Without the help of the Friends we could not even have started. We are immensely grateful. We are also very anxious for the whole future of the Cathedral. Instead of a long report this year, may I ask you to turn to page 9 and read a letter which we recently circulated from the Cathedral. And when you have read it, would you think whether you could double your subscription.

We have lost an old and valued member of Council in Mr. W. E. Dedrick. No one has given us greater help and encouragement. Happily we now have Mrs. Dedrick on the Council. Other Friends who have died are Mrs. King, Miss Rampton (aged 101), Mr. J. S. Trice (a founder member), Sir A. Gouge, Mr. L. Bull, Mrs. Foa (aged 93), Mrs. Sharp, and finally Mr. Hayes, a recent member of the Council, who designed last year's Christmas Card and died suddenly on April 21st.

The office has been redecorated by Mr. Langdon and has now a more welcoming appearance. But Mr. Cooper has had to give up his regular mornings there. We wish him better health and thank him for his long and faithful service.

THE DEAN'S LETTER

£3,000 a year is the average deficit in the Cathedral Accounts for the last few years. I think the position ought to be known.

- (a) *Salaries of Cathedral Staff* have been recently increased (some for the first time since 1947). The increases have been provided by Grants from the Church Commissioners.
- (b) *Maintenance of Cathedral Services*. The Cathedral is now warm, but it costs more than when it was cold. Other expenses have risen, too. The increase of £500 a year in Collections and Boxes falls far short of increased costs.
- (c) *Special Needs*. The "Friends" pay for many of the special needs, like the loud-speaker system, organ, upkeep of Cloister Garth, and are now cleaning and restoring the Cloisters.
- (d) *Maintenance of Cathedral Fabric*. Our ancient Cathedral is a national treasure. The Nation pays nothing; but industries in the Diocese and other benefactors provide £3,000 a year through the Appeal Fund. This is insufficient, and our capital is being eaten into. Urgent work, including fire safety precautions and the security of the tower and spire, cannot be faced.
- (e) *Cathedral Property*. This should provide income, but some is still let on lease at an uneconomic rent until it can be reviewed.

Economies are difficult. A few small savings are possible, e.g., in printing Service Sheets, and reducing heating and lighting. We are reluctant to economise on Staff for care and cleaning.

Income. I hope for more Friends, and for still more Parishes, Schools and other bodies to become Corporate Friends.

I hope that Friends will make a special effort to complete the saving of the Cloisters (£3,000) which otherwise will perish. Gifts of £5 to £500 have already been promised.

I hope that a few more firms will contribute through the Appeal Fund.

I hope that general giving in Collections will increase considerably. And better than that, I hope that Income Tax payers will undertake covenanted subscriptions and only put a small coin in the bag.

I hope we shall not only pay for the Cathedral needs. There are country parishes in the Diocese which give more to Missions than Rochester Cathedral does.

REPORT OF THE HON. SECRETARY AND TREASURER

MEMBERSHIP

TOWARDS the end of 1962 we passed the 1,200 mark; but owing to several deaths in the first quarter of 1963, we have come back to 1,198. This is an increase of 35 over last year, and is very largely due to the efforts of Colonel Barton Wills, and for which we are very grateful. In any case, membership has continued to grow annually, which is most gratifying.

FINANCE

We have paid £1,599 for repairs to the Garth so far, and, bearing in mind that we do not treat Life subscriptions as income of the year (these now total £333), and that we keep a reserve of £500 Defence Bonds, it will be seen that our current reserves are rather slender. We owe £175 for more Pitkin Guides, and about £100 for the cost of this Report.

Postage has gone up—so many Reminders have to be sent. If only more subscribers could see their way to pay by Banker's Order they, and we, should be saved trouble and expense.

We are grateful for legacies of £150 from Miss A. Caswell, of £25 from Miss C. E. Cork, and of £10 from Mr. D. L. Rowles. The balances on 31st March 1963 were:

THE LADIES' GUILD

THE Ladies' Guild, founded in 1947, continues to be in a very strong position with a membership of 40. Many of the members meet at the Deanery once a month in order to keep cassocks, surplices and other items in good repair.

Already some forty-eight of other designs, some by Miss Mary White, have been finished, and are now in use. Also six large pieces of embroidery of gold fleur-de-lys with a rich blue background, designed by Mrs. Harland, are being mounted as cushions for use in the stalls of the Lady Chapel. Not only do the members sew, but some are responsible for cleaning the brass-work in the Cathedral.

The grateful thanks of the Ladies' Guild are due to Mrs. Stannard for her warm welcome and kind hospitality at the Deanery.

THE MUSIC OF THE CATHEDRAL

UNDER this heading in last year's Report, the work of the Cathedral Choir was recorded in some detail. This year it is felt that the work of the Cathedral Special Choir should be similarly explained.

Formed in June 1957, principally to sing at the 6.30 p.m. Service in the Nave, the Cathedral Special Choir also sings the Statutory Services on Sundays in the place of the regular Cathedral Choir during the holidays and by this means the Choral Services on Sundays are maintained during the whole of the fifty-two weeks in the year without a break. The Cathedral is indeed very fortunate in having a second body of singers whose achievements are of a high order.

The membership of the Choir is on a voluntary basis, which in itself says all the more for the regular maintenance of the excellent standard in all aspects of the Choir's functions.

The music sung is taken almost entirely from the Cathedral Music Library and altogether the repertory includes approximately 75 anthems and some 20 Service settings.
