### PARTICULARS OF MEMBERSHIP

THE Association of the Friends of Rochester Cathedral was formed in 1935, as it was felt that there were many who would like to be associated with this ancient and interesting church and to have a share in the preservation and upkeep of the fabric.

The Diocese and Cathedral of Rochester go back to the beginning of English Christianity. This is not to be confused with Christianity in what we now speak of as England, for Christianity flourished in Kent soon after the year A.D. 200, and although there is no proof of a Christian Church in Rochester in those early days, there is at least a likelihood that there was one. The Mission sent by Pope Gregory the Great, and welcomed and aided by King Ethelbert, secured the founding of the See of Canterbury about A.D. 597, and those of Rochester and London in A.D. 604. Close to the West Door of the Cathedral the foundations of the apse of the old Saxon Church were discovered-semicircular lines just inside the Cathedral mark the site-and the foundations of its Nave walls were traced running westwards across the cemetery outside. No foundations of a western apse have been discovered. The Cathedral Church as it stands to-day is an interesting epitome of English architecture from early Norman to the present century—the latter represented by restoration work.

Cathedral, and thus to help the Dean and Chapter to bear the responsibility of preserving for future generations a building which stands for so much in the history of our National Church.

Since the inauguration over 1,600 Friends have enrolled themselves, and their contributions have resulted in much valuable work in several ways. Important and necessary repairs to the fabric have been carried out, especially to parapets, roofs, and copings. During the war, funds were supplied by the Friends for defence work against bomb damage, blast, and fire. But it is especially due to their efforts that there has been revealed the interest and beauty of the Monastic Cloisters, its buildings, and its garth. The Chapter House doorway has been opened and the exquisite Romanesque carving of its masonry shown. Within the Chapter House, Priors' burial places have been discovered; the foundations of the pillars which carried a gallery across the west end from the dormitory to the Cathedral have been exposed; the refectory doorway and its adjacent washing-trough have been made objects of interest; and the fine vaulted archway entered from the main road of the Precinct has been opened out. Of the Cellarer's buildings some walls have been shown, and the Tudor buttresses clearly tell what King Henry the Eighth planned for the housing of his retinue. Funds are urgently needed for all this work. Will you become a Friend and help?

The minimum subscription has been fixed at 5s. per annum, which it is hoped will enable all who wish to do so to enrol themselves, but it is also hoped that many will be able to give larger sums. There is also a Corporate Membership for Schools, Colleges, Parochial Church Councils, etc., with a minimum subscription of 10s. per annum, whilst Individual Life Membership is £10, or Joint Life Membership, for husband and wife, £15 15s. Boys and girls under 18 years of age, 2s. per annum. Each Friend receives a Card of Membership

and a copy of the Annual Report is sent to each Member other than Junior Members, when published. A form of application will be found at the end of this Report and should be sent to the Honorary Secretary, The Deanery, Rochester.

Friends who visit the Cathedral and attend Festivals are asked to wear the Badge of Membership, illustrated on the cover. It consists of a gold scallop on a red field with the words "Friends of Rochester Cathedral" round the rim and the date of the inception. Badges are 1s. 6d. (1s. for Junior Members) and may be obtained from the Honorary Secretary.

### THE ANNUAL REPORT

THE great event which confronts us is The Celebration of the 1350th Anniversary of the Founding of the Diocese of Rochester.

On Monday, 17th May, the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury will visit Rochester to inaugurate the Celebration, and on the following day Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth, the Queen Mother, will be present at a Civic Service of Thanksgiving in the Cathedral. During the ensuing three weeks there will be a number of special Services with distinguished visiting preachers, an Exhibition of Church Treasures will be arranged in the Crypt, and in the evenings there will be music or the showing of films. Teas will be available in tents in the Cloister Garth. An outline programme of the events will be found on another page.

#### The Festival

Friends will notice that The Festival of the Association of the Friends of the Cathedral will form one of the events of the Celebration. It is to be held on Wednesday, 2ND June, and we look forward to welcoming as the Preacher, The Very Reverend the Dean of Westminster. The programme for the day will be as follows:

- 8 a.m. Holy Communion. Celebrant: The Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Rochester.
- 9.30 a.m. Mattins (Plain).
- 10.30 a.m. Conducted Tours of the Cathedral.
- 11.30 a.m. Holy Communion (Choral).
- 2.15 p.m. Gathering of Friends and Annual Meeting of the Association in the Cloister Garth.
- 3.15 p.m. Festival Service of the Friends in the Quire. Preacher: The Very Reverend A. Don, K.C.V.O., D.D., Dean of Westminster.
- 4.30 p.m. Tea obtainable in the Cloister Garth.
  - 7 p.m. Showing of Films in the Cathedral.

For this year, in view of the other events of the Celebration, the Meeting and the Tea will be in the Cloister Garth.

Since the last Annual Report the Reverend R. J. Stockdale, M.C., who has been our Honorary Secretary for the past six years, has felt it necessary to hand over his responsibilities to a successor, and our new Honorary Secretary is the Reverend Rupert Johnstone, the Cathedral Sacrist. We are very grateful to Mr. Stockdale for all he has done for the Association and the friendly relations which he has maintained with the Members, and it is my intention at the Annual General Meeting to propose him to be a Member of the Council. To Mr. Johnstone, his successor, we offer a hearty welcome, and the time will soon come when he is as well known to the Members of the Association as was his predecessor.

## The Cathedral Appeal

This appeal is perhaps the most important thing I have to mention in this Report. More than £40,000 has already been given or promised, much of it in the form of valuable Seven Year Covenants, and we earnestly hope that the remainder of the sum required will be forthcoming within the next few months. We are greatly indebted to the Friends both for a generous donation from the funds of the Association and to a great number of individual Members for personal donations. It would be impossible here to mention the numerous kind donations received, though these have been acknowledged up to date in the local Press. Extremely generous gifts have been received from Industry (particularly the Paper Industry), from Banks, the Medway Conservancy, the Wardens of Rochester Bridge, the Rochester, Chatham, and Gillingham Law Society, from Schools and Hospitals, the City of Rochester, many Business Houses and Firms, and from members of the Farmers' Union. The Pilgrim Trust have again given us generous assistance, as have many Churches, Parochial Church Councils, Drama Societies, Freemasons' Lodges, H.M. Ships, Naval and Military Establishments, and the Rotary Club of Rochester. In response to a personal appeal by Dr. Greene, subscriptions have been received from many members of the Medical Profession. Eventually the names of all subscribers will be recorded in a book to be kept for ever in the Cathedral.

The actual work on the fabric has, during the past year, been confined to repairs which needed to be done urgently.

Most important of these was the complicated task of checking an outbreak of dry rot in one of the great diagonal roof trusses over the eastern crossing. Dry rot under the guttering on the north and south side of the Presbytery has also been dealt with.

A general check of guttering and down pipes has been made throughout the building, and first-aid repairs have been made to the lead work of the spire. One access door to the roof space has been renewed and others have been attended to.

Progress has been made with the new scheme of electric lighting for the Cathedral, and of especial interest is the renovation and repair of the Cathedral's famous Crypt. The vaulting has been lime-washed, new lighting has been installed, and the Choir Vestries, which for the past sixty years have so largely excluded the light from the south side, have been removed to a new site in the Slype.

The British Broadcasting Corporation have kindly arranged for "The Week's Good Cause" at 8.25 p.m. on Sunday, 4th July, to be devoted to the Rochester Cathedral Appeal.

Once again I have to acknowledge the valuable work of the Members of *The Ladies' Guild*, including the ladies who maintain the brass work in the Cathedral and those who month by month attend to the requisite repairs of many and various kinds.

### Finance

Once again Mr. Lawrance Bull has kindly carried out this duty in an honorary capacity; we are greatly indebted to him for performing this service and tender our sincere thanks and deep appreciation.
